#### Free Wi-Fi

Register for free public Wi-Fi service with your foreign number at any Wireless@ SG hotspot across Singapore, and receive your login details via an SMS message. Overseas charges may apply. Alternatively, you can rent a pocket Wi-Fi device at Singapore Visitor Centre (orchardgateway) or Changi Recommends at Changi Airport.



#### **SIM Card**

Telcos in Singapore have ceased the provision of 2G network in Singapore. To attain 3G/4G roaming, buy a Singapore prepaid SIM card from Singapore Visitor Centre (orchardgateway), Changi Recommends or telecommunications retail shops located at the airport, major shopping malls and convenience stores islandwide.

## **HANDY TIPS**

Follow these pointers to make the best of your stay.

#### **GST Refund**

Payment by cash and cards is safe and efficient in Singapore. Tipping is not a common practice as service charge has been factored into the Goods and Services Tax (GST). As a tourist in Singapore, you can claim a refund on 7% GST under the Tourist Tax Refund Scheme if you make any purchase more than S\$100 at the participating shops. Here's how to go about it:

Look out for these signs at the shops.







- 2. When making purchases from retailers who are on the Electronic Tourist Refund Scheme (eTRS), you are required to show your passport in person to prove your eligibility under the TRS. Photocopies or images of passports are not acceptable. The retailer will then issue an eTRS transaction to you at the point of purchase with your passport details.
- 3. Apply for your tax refund at the eTRS self-help kiosks located at Singapore Changi Airport's Departure Check-In Hall (before departure immigration) and Departure Transit Lounge (after departure immigration); and at Seletar Airport Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) duty office.
- 4. At the eTRS kiosk, scan your passport to retrieve all your purchase details.
- 5. If you are departing from Changi Airport, you can choose to have the refund credited directly into your credit card, Alipay account (for Chinese citizens only) or get a cash refund. If you are departing from Seletar Airport, you will be asked to choose your refund to be made by credit card, Alipay (for Chinese citizens only) or bank cheque. Once you are done. review the outcome of your refund request shown on the eTRS kiosk to check if you need to go to the Customs Inspection counter, where custom officers may ask to see your purchases for further verification.
- 6. Due to the handling fees, the refunded amount will be less than the original GST amount charged. The details of your transactions can be verified by registering and logging into the eTRS e-Services at https://touristrefund.sg or via the "eTRS Singapore" app downloadable from Google Play or Apple App Store.

#### **Local Tips**

- Keep to the left on escalators, especially during peak hours.
- When taking public transport, always give way to alighting passengers. Board buses from the front door and exit by the rear door. Remember to press the 'stop' button early.
- Some items like pets and durians are not allowed on public transport.





- Singaporeans love queueing. If you see a gueue, check out what's at the front of it-you might be in for a treat!
- Singapore does not have a tipping culture, but if you'd like to express your appreciation for the service you have received, please feel free to do so.

An expression of great satisfaction and pleasure.

66 The food in hawker centres like Lau Pa Sat and Tekka Market is very shiok!



## **PARK LIFE**

A City in a Garden, Singapore is home to numerous green sanctuaries that are easily accessed from the city centre.



## **Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park**

A three-kilometre-long river flanked by wildflowers flows through this scenic park, which is a popular venue for outdoor activities like cycling, jogging, tai chi (internal Chinese martial art) and voga, Besides a variety of plants and birds, you will also spot various soil bioengineering techniques that are applied to stabilise these riverbanks. Biotopes naturally clean the river water and bioswales reduce surface run-off. Occasionally visited by Singapore's wild otter family, this park has a wheelchair-accessible merry-goround and swing that are both wheelchair accessible.



## 01 Explore a colourful and historic temple

Dedicated to the Mother Goddess Sri Periyachi,

Sri Vadapathira Kaliamman Temple (555
Serangoon Road) began as a picture of this deity under a banyan tree and gradually expanded into an intricate temple. Take some time to admire its huge statues and detailed reliefs, which were recently refurbished. Some place their new-borns at the feet of this guardian goddess to ask for her blessings.

Along the same street, traditional delicacies and creative desserts can be enjoyed at 49 The Singapura Club (102 Dunlop Street), which shifted here from Tiong Bahru. Foodies seeking more traditional dishes should check out @ The Banana Leaf Apolo (54 Race Course Road), which serves classic Indian delicacies like its famous fish head curry.



### 03 Discover endearing keepsakes

Take your pick from an array of traditional Indian iewellery at Malabar Gold & Diamonds (121 Serangoon Road) and enjoy 24/7 shopping in 3 Mustafa Centre (145 Syed Alwi Road), a massive shopping complex that sells everything from traditional treats and tableware to tovs and luxury timepieces. Featured in the Wallpaper\* City Guide, the Louis Vuitton City Guide and Monocle, @ Onlewo (129) Jalan Besar) translates to "safe and happy nest" in Chinese and retails everyday items like plates, business card cases, silk scarves, cushion covers and glass sculptures emblazoned with motifs of Singaporean culture.

Don't miss the **Deepavali Light-Up** (7 Sep-10 Nov), which will deck Little India in colourful decorations and lights. Check out the Indian Heritage Centre's Culturefest (22 Nov-1 Dec) too, where you can learn about the history and artistry of Singapore's Indian community, through panel discussions, performances and workshops.

#### JALAN BESAR

Not too far from Little India, you can witness the various facets of old and new Singapore by taking a walk through historic Jalan Besar, which translates to "Big Road". Explore some of its smaller roads, which are named after WWI generals, and discover beautifully restored shophouses. Jalan Besar is known for its vibrant cafe culture, where hip cafes like Chye Seng Huat Hardware (150 Tyrwhitt Road) hold masterclasses on coffee making and coffee appreciation. This historic road is flanked by places of worship like Abdul Gafoor Mosque (41 Dunlop Street) and the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes (50 Ophir Road), along with popular restaurants like CreatureS (120 Desker Road) and Swee Choon Tim Sum Restaurant (183-191 Jalan Besar).






